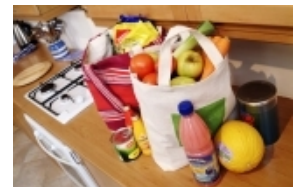

It's a Fact

Recycle for Cornwall supporters have proved that recycling 60% of your household rubbish is easy, so easy in fact that over the last six months, two supporters from Wadebridge have recycled 81% of their rubbish from their home and garden. They have estimated that over the first 6 months of 2005 just 99 kilos (about 5 bags of potatoes worth) have been sent to landfill from their house and a whopping 426.5 kilos (that's about 21 bags of potatoes) worth has been recycled!



They are now looking at ways they can reduce and reuse their waste in the first place.
